


Transforming to Better Serve You

Troy Regional Medical Center celebrated 53 years of service to the residents of Pike and surrounding counties in June 2022. The medical center has grown and developed into a regional provider of high-quality healthcare.

Troy Regional Medical Center is licensed for 97 beds and is fully accredited by The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations.

The hospital is city-owned and is operated under the direction of The Troy Hospital Health Care Authority Board. The medical center is home to more than 30 physicians, surgeons, and advanced practice providers offering specialty services in emergency medicine, orthopedics, sports

medicine, gynecology, anesthesiology, pain management, psychiatry, diabetes, surgery, family medicine, internal medicine, ENT, oncology/hematology, senior behavioral care, medical detox, pediatrics, podiatry, radiology, wound care, and sleep disorders. Troy Regional Medical Center provides an in-hospital rehabilitation swing bed service as well as an extensive range of outpatient services, both diagnostic and for treatment.

Troy Regional Medical Center has more than 325 full- and part-time employees and is an important economic partner in our Troy community. I am honored and humbled to lead this fine group each day.

The hospital recently announced the opening of Troy Regional Wound Care and Hyperbaric Medicine Center, an outpatient facility offering a comprehensive approach for patients with non-healing wounds. Additionally, we celebrated the opening of the newly renovated Women's Imaging Center, which houses the latest in 3D mammography services, Bone Densitometry, and Ultrasound. Other improvements within the Diagnostic Imaging area included the upgrade to an advanced 80 slice CT scanner allowing for faster, more diagnostic scans including Cardiac scanning. We have also committed additional resources into the areas of Primary Care/Family Medicine with the opening of Troy Regional Primary Care, located on our campus.

Troy Regional has grown over the past five decades, and with strong leadership, exceptional clinicians, our remarkable team, and the Troy community's support, that growth continues today.



Effects of COVID on TRMC





Teamwork, COVID-19, and Beyond

No matter which department they work in, each member of the Troy Regional team was touched by COVID-19 in some way. Those on the front lines worked through exhaustion, stress, and heartbreak to be there for our patients and their families. I am beyond grateful for their compassion, skill, and unshakable dedication.

In the early months of the pandemic, our staff demonstrated the ability to adapt to rapid change. Following the science, we introduced new, evolving clinical processes and updated guidance on masking, PPE use, social distancing, and other precautions. Our team acted to protect our patients and our staff, as well as their own families.

In early 2020, our first team meeting about COVID brought up the urgent need to set up an outdoor screening area. Immediately, new teams formed and set up and opened the drive-thru COVID testing site for our community. We also began offering drive-thru vaccine clinics in Elba and Brundidge, later holding clinics in many area industries and businesses. Troy Regional continues to offer the COVID vaccine each Friday with a walk-in clinic.

The new teams that came out of this situation enhanced relationships and created a workforce feeling more empowered to make suggestions for quality improvement. I am so proud of the work that was done and is

still being done each day by the team here at TRMC. We often refer to ourselves as "family" ... and that is exactly what we are. We saw drastic changes in patient volumes in many areas. The 2020 impact of COVID on outpatient testing was significant with the reverse effect on areas like ER and Surgery volumes. The fears associated with elective medical visits often kept people from seeking routine and emergency care. We are proud to report late 2021 and 2022 numbers rebounding. The vaccination rates and decreases in COVID prevalence and severity seem to be allowing not just stability, but growth in many service lines.

We want this community to know we are here for you and committed to providing excellent care, close to home.




Hospital Inpatient Admissions

FY 2022




Hospital Observation Admissions

2013	Silver Supper – Funds raised \$22,500 – Purchased 10 sleep chairs for patient rooms, 1 ICU patient bed, and a Bovie machine used in surgery
2014	Balloon Release – Funds raised \$24,300 – Renovated Emergency Department waiting area and Radiology Department to enhance patient flow and comfort of family members
2014	Restricted Grant received \$40,300. Annual spending of these limited to no more than \$5,000 per year based on the discretion of the foundation board.
